The Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA) is a State Government Executive Department with a service mission to assist veterans, active duty service members, their families and dependents, in securing benefits earned through military service.

The Service and Benefits Program provides assistance in obtaining benefits from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Department of Defense, State of Maryland and other programs for veterans and their families. Located in communities throughout Maryland, MDVA Service Officers assist veterans and their eligible dependents in acquiring benefits.
